 The BIA will be hosting "Construction Watch Parties" on Thursday evenings beginning in June on the lawn of the Town Hall and business owners and residents are all invited to come and visit, play games and then join Chair at Cruiser Night for the weekly announcement of winner or \$100 gift voucher for use in any business on High Street in the construction zone

Ballots for draws will be given at POS, 1 for every \$25 spent and the voucher is good until Oct 31

- 400 branded blue sand pails and shovels will be distributed to businesses for distribution as they choose The cost of these came out of the Town's
- Sara will be leading a delegation to Council (awaiting date), to inform them of our year to date and the plans to come. ALSO, to advocate for the space in front of the Town Hall and Library be a gathering space with shade, great seating and possibly some sort of interactive activity. The BIA would also like to suggest that the Town install exterior showers at the change/washrooms at the Beach (at some future date see Grand Bend for reference. The idea is that day trippers, particularly cyclists and bikers, may wish to shower prior to dining out in Southampton.
- Gran Fondo Lisa and Sara met with Martin Graham from the SMHF asking how best GF can engage High Street Businesses.

Sara suggested that there could be some sort of event at Shindig that would encourage donations to SMHF - possibly a bed race

- Break in Vintage Vault on High Street (not a BIA member as that building is not zoned commercial), was broken into with much damage and theft.
- Vicinity an app developed especially for BIAs. Sara and Kendall met the developers at the OBIAA Conference and Lisa and Sara subsequently had a phone conference to investigate the possibility of SS becoming a test market in North America. The app not only has more functionality that a traditional website in terms of showing a business directory, it will also accommodate updates by owners to feature sales, promotions, events, and will allow the BIA to create a more immersive experience with both Members and the public. It would also accommodate tourist-oriented activities such as maps for walks and cycling, event maps (Santa Summit or Wine and Cheese Fest) and loyalty programmes. Finally, the app would allow the BIA to easily track and collect data about users and events. It is becoming absolutely necessary that the BIA be collecting data on events and activity in order to support our applications for funding and demonstrating the of viability of our initiatives with Members and the Town.

The app is presently all inclusive with programmes beginning at \$15 - 20,000, While this seems expensive, the result may be well worth it and we will investigate partnering with the Town, County and PEBIA to share costs under the Explore the Shores umbrella
